Dr Nichol is a dedicated rural doctor providing crucial medical services to the Queensland community of Winton. Raised in the Queensland sugar town of Childers, Dr Nichol studied Medicine at JCU (Townsville) before undertaking prevocational training at Caboolture Hospital and then Advanced Skills Training in Emergency Medicine at Bundaberg.

He commenced duties as a Senior Medical Officer (SMO) Provisional Fellow at Winton in February 2016 and recently completed his primary rural and remote training there.
